*Vertebrate Paleontology of Arizona* was produced to coincide with the Society of Vertebrate Paleontology (SVP) annual meeting hosted by the Mesa Southwest Museum (now the AZMNH) in 2005. The first comprehensive survey of the vertebrate fossils of Arizona ever published, *Vertebrate Paleontology of Arizona* compiles many contributions from active researchers in the field. As the title indicates, the volume is a wide ranging documentation of vertebrate fossil studies from the state. Vertebrate fossils have been recovered throughout Arizona and across a wide variety of geologic time intervals, and the contributing authors have provided an excellent up-to-date introduction and reference. Included are faunal lists, site descriptions, and taxonomic discussions. 180 pages.
